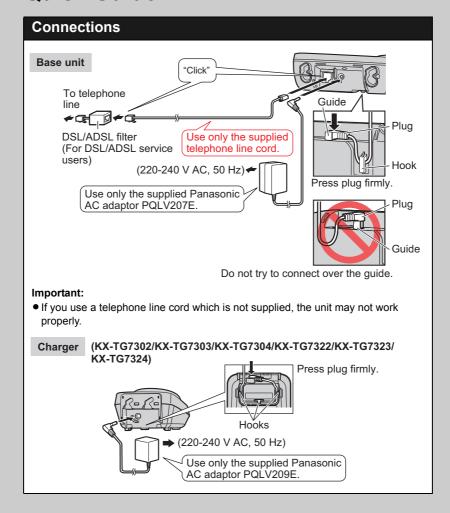

# Battery installation/Battery charge

# Charge for about 7 hours. Rechargeable Ni-MH ONLY "Charging" will be displayed. Base unit \*1 Charger \*2 "Charging" will be displayed.

- \*1 Model shown is KX-TG7301.
- \*2 KX-TG7302/KX-TG7303/ KX-TG7304/KX-TG7322/ KX-TG7323/KX-TG7324

#### Note:

- USE ONLY Ni-MH batteries AAA (R03) size.
- Do NOT use Alkaline/Manganese/Ni-Cd batteries.



# Operating tips

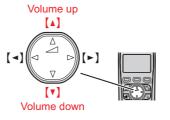
#### Using the navigator key

The handset navigator key can be used to navigate through menus and to select items shown on the display by pressing [A], [V], [V], or [V].

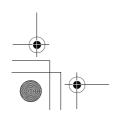
To adjust the receiver or speaker volume, press [▲] to increase the volume, or press [▼] to decrease the volume repeatedly while talking.

#### Soft keys

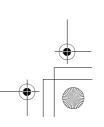
The handset features 3 soft keys. By pressing a soft key, you can select the feature shown directly above it on the display.













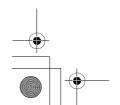




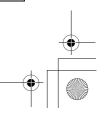
# Date and time (Handset)

- 1 (middle soft key)
- **2** [v]/[ $\blacktriangle$ ]: "Handset Setup"  $\rightarrow$  **OK**
- 3 [v]/[ $\Delta$ ]: "Time Settings"  $\rightarrow$  OK
- **4** [v]/[ $\Delta$ ]: "Set Date & Time"  $\rightarrow$  **OK**
- **5** Enter the current date, month, and year.
- **6** Enter the current hour and minute.
- 7 OK  $\rightarrow$  [ $\checkmark$ 0]

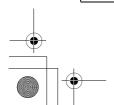

Frequently asked questions		
Question	Cause/solution	
Why is <b>Y</b> flashing?	<ul> <li>The handset is too far from the base unit. Move closer.</li> <li>The base unit's AC adaptor is not connected. Check the connections.</li> <li>You are using the handset or base unit in an area with high electrical interference. Place the base unit and use the handset away from sources of interference.</li> <li>The handset is not registered to the base unit. Register it (page 6).</li> </ul>	
What should I do when the handset does not turn on?	<ul> <li>Make sure the batteries are installed correctly.</li> <li>Fully charge the batteries.</li> <li>Clean the charge contacts and charge again.</li> </ul>	
How long is the battery operating time?	When you are using fully-charged Ni-MH batteries (supplied batteries);     In continuous use: 17 hours max.     Not in use (standby): 150 hours max.      It is normal for batteries not to reach full capacity at the initial charge. Maximum battery performance is reached after a few complete cycles of charge/discharge (use).      Actual battery performance depends on a combination of how often the handset is in use and how often it is not in use (standby).	
Can I keep the handset on the base unit or charger when I am not using it?	Even after the handset is fully charged, the handset can be left on the base unit or charger without any ill effect on the batteries.	
When should I replace the batteries?	If the batteries are fully charged until  is displayed, but  is displayed after a few calls, replace the batteries with new ones.	
What is a PIN?	<ul> <li>The PIN is a 4-digit number that must be entered in order to change certain base unit settings. The default PIN is "0000".</li> </ul>	



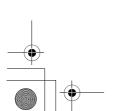








Frequently asked questions		
Question	Cause/solution	
What should I do to display caller information?	<ul> <li>You must subscribe to a Caller ID service. Contact your service provider/telephone company for details.</li> <li>The message "You must first subscribe to Caller ID." will be displayed until you receive caller information after subscribing to a Caller ID service.</li> </ul>	
What should I do when noise is heard, sound cuts in and out?	<ul> <li>You are using the handset or base unit in an area with high electrical interference. Place the base unit and use the handset away from sources of interference.</li> <li>Move closer to the base unit.</li> <li>If you use a DSL/ADSL service, we recommend connecting a DSL/ADSL filter between the base unit and the telephone line jack. Contact your DSL/ADSL provider for details.</li> </ul>	
What should I do when the operating time seems to be shorter even after I fully charged the batteries?	Clean the battery ends (⊕, ⊝) and the charge contacts with a dry cloth, and charge again.	
What do I need to do to erase *) (Missed call) from the display?	<ul> <li>There are unviewed missed calls remaining. View them using the following method.</li> <li>1 ⊞ (middle soft key)</li> <li>2 [▼]/[▲]: "Caller List" → OK</li> <li>3 Press [▼] to search from the most recent call, or press [▲] to search from the oldest call.</li> </ul>	





















# Registering a handset to the base unit

The supplied handset and base unit are pre-registered. If for some reason the handset is not registered to the base unit, register the handset.

#### Handset

- 1 (middle soft key)
- 2 [V]/[A]: "Handset Setup"  $\rightarrow$  OK
- 3 [▼]/[▲]: "Register H.set" → OK





#### Base unit

Proceed with the operation for your model.

#### ■ KX-TG7301/KX-TG7302/KX-TG7303/ KX-TG7304

Press and hold [1) for about 5 seconds. (No registration tone)



Press and hold [•10] for about 5 seconds, until the registration tone sounds.

• The next step should be completed within 90 seconds.







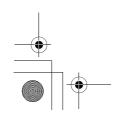

#### OK

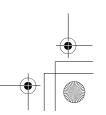
• When the handset has been registered successfully, f Y stops flashing.







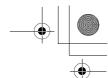
