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### Important information

#### General

- Use only the AC adaptor included with this product, noted on page 4.
- Do not connect the AC adaptor to any AC outlet other than a standard 220-240 V AC outlet.
- This product is unable to make calls when:
- the portable handset battery(ies) need recharging or have failed.
- there is a power failure.
- Do not open the base unit, charger, or handset other than to replace the battery(ies).
- This product should not be used near emergency/intensive care medical equipment and should not be used by people with pacemakers.
- Care should be taken that objects do not fall onto, and liquids are not spilled into, the unit. Do not subject this product to excessive smoke, dust, mechanical vibration or shock.

#### **Environment**

- Do not use this product near water.
- This product should be kept away from heat sources such as radiators, cookers, etc. It should also not be placed in rooms where the temperature is less than 5  $^{\circ}\text{C}$  or greater than 40 °C.
- The AC adaptor is used as the main disconnect device. Ensure that the AC outlet is installed near the product and is easily accessible.





# Bone conduction earpiece (KX-TG7180 only)

The handset features a bone conduction earpiece that uses vibrations to create sound during your telephone conversations. For proper operation press the bone conduction earpiece against your face near the ear.

Normally, sound enters the ear canal and vibrates the eardrum. People feel the vibration within the inner ear and comprehend it as it is received by the auditory nerve.



Place the bone conduction earpiece against your face (not your ear). Try different locations to find which location works best. Start with the temple area.



#### Note:

- Do not place the bone conduction earpiece on a hearing aid. Howling or other interference may be heard.
- The effectiveness of the bone conduction earpiece will vary by the type and degree of hearing loss of the user.




















- As sound is generated by vibration, users with normal hearing can use the handset by placing the bone conduction earpiece against the ear, as an ordinary telephone.
- If the bone conduction earpiece gets dusty or greasy, clean it with a soft, dry cloth.





#### Note:

- Never install telephone wiring during a lightning storm.
- The AC adaptor must remain connected at all times. (It is normal for the adaptor to feel warm during use.)
- The AC adaptor should be connected to a vertically oriented or floor-mounted AC outlet. Do not connect the AC adaptor to a ceiling-mounted AC outlet, as the weight of the adaptor may cause it to become disconnected.
- The unit will not work during a power failure. We therefore recommend you also connect a corded-type telephone (without AC adaptor) to the same telephone line using a T-adaptor. Your Panasonic sales shop can offer you more information about connection possibilities.

 away from electrical appliances such as TVs, radios, personal computers or other phones.


# Battery installation/replacement

#### Important:

- Use only the included rechargeable batteries noted on page 4, 7.
- When replacing batteries, we recommend using the Panasonic rechargeable batteries noted on page 5, 7.
- Wipe the battery ends (⊕, ⊕) with a dry cloth.
- When installing the batteries, avoid touching the battery ends (⊕, ⊝) or the unit contacts.
- Press the notch on the handset cover firmly and slide it in the direction of the arrow.
  - When replacing batteries, remove the old batteries positive (+) end first.



2 Insert the batteries negative (○) end first. Close the handset cover.
























### **Battery charge**

Place the handset on the base unit for about 7 hours before initial use.

When charging, the battery icon is shown as follows.



When the batteries are fully charged, [III] remains on the display.

• The charge indicator lights up when the handset is placed on the base unit.



• The pictured model is KX-TG7160.

#### Note:

- It is normal for the handset to feel warm during charging.
- If you want to use the unit immediately, charge the batteries for at least 15 minutes.
- Clean the charge contacts of the handset and base unit with a soft, dry cloth once a month, otherwise the batteries may not charge properly. Clean more often if the unit is exposed to grease, dust, or high humidity.

#### Note:

- It is normal for batteries not to reach full capacity at the initial charge. Maximum battery performance is reached after a few complete cycles of charge/discharge (use).
- Actual battery performance depends on a combination of how often the handset is in use and how often it is not in use (standby).
- Battery operating time may be shortened over time depending on usage conditions and ambient temperature.
- Even after the handset is fully charged, the handset can be left on the base unit without any ill effect on the batteries.
- The battery strength may not be displayed correctly after you replace the batteries. In this case, place the handset on the base unit and charge for at least 7 hours.

















# Turning the power on/off

#### Power on

Press [ > 0] for about 1 second.

#### Power off

Press [ > 0] for about 2 seconds.

#### Note:

- To correct a digit, press [◄] or [►] to move the cursor to the digit, then make the correction.
- The date and time may be incorrect after a power failure. In this case, set the date and time again.


















#### Voice announce

The voice announce features allow the handset to announce displayed phone number. (Caller ID announce/List announce)

#### **Caller ID announce**

When you receive an outside call which has phone number information, the handset announces the displayed phone number from the handset speaker.

- To announce outside caller's phone number, you must first subscribe to Caller ID service (page 23).
- The announcement is heard at the ringer volume (page 19).

#### List announce

The handset announces phone numbers from the handset speaker while you are viewing the **redial list**, **caller list**, and **phonebook**.

 If the displayed phone number has a P(pause), the handset inserts a 0.5 second pause for each P and if the number has the other symbols, (for example, \*, #, etc.) the handset skips the symbols and announces the next number.

# Setting volume for voice announce

You can set the volume for **list announce**. The volume for caller ID announce is set when setting the ringer volume on (page 19).

- 3 "Other Options"  $\rightarrow$  [ $\triangleright$ ]
- 4 "Voice Announce" → [▶]

 To turn the voice announce feature off, select the volume "off".

#### 7 $[ \rightarrow ] \rightarrow [ \circlearrowleft 0]$

#### Note:

 The caller ID announce is heard at the handset ringer volume (page 19). When the volume for voice announce is set to "Off", the handset does not announce the phone number regardless of the ringer volume.














# **Making calls**

- 1 Lift the handset and dial the phone number.
  - To correct a digit, press [C/⋈], then enter the correct number.
- 2 [ ]
- 3 When finished talking, press [ఀఀ♠♠] or place the handset on the base unit.

#### Speakerphone

- 1 During a conversation, press [♣] to turn on the speakerphone.
  - Speak alternately with the caller.
- 2 When finished talking, press [★①].

#### Note:

- For best performance, use the speakerphone in a quiet environment.
- To switch back to the receiver, press
   [ ].

To adjust the receiver or speaker volume Press (▲) or (▼) while on a call.

#### Redial feature

Previously dialled phone numbers (each 24 digits max.) can be redialled.

#### To make a call using the redial list

The last 10 phone numbers dialled are stored in the redial list.

- 2 Press (▲) or (▼) to select the desired number.
- 3 [~]/[呤]

#### To erase numbers in the redial list

- 1 [3]
- 2 Press (▲) or (▼) to select the desired number. → (►)

- 3 "Erase"  $\rightarrow$  [ $\triangleright$ ]

#### Other features

#### Mute

While mute is turned on, you will be able to hear the other party, but the other party will not be able to hear you.

To mute your voice, press [C/⋈].

To return to the conversation, press
 【C/☒】again.

#### Call waiting - [R] button

If a second call is received while in a conversation with the first caller, a beep tone will be heard. Press **[R]** button to switch between callers.

This service requires a subscription. Consult your service provider/telephone company for details.

#### Note

- If your unit is connected to a PBX (private branch exchange), pressing [R] can allow you to access certain features of your host PBX such as transferring an extension call. Consult your PBX dealer for details.
- You can change the recall time (page 22).

# Pause button (for PBX/long distance service users)

A pause is sometimes required when making calls using a PBX or long distance service.

**Example:** If you have to dial **(0)** before dialling outside numbers manually, you will probably need to pause after dialling **(0)** until you hear a dial tone.

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### **Answering calls**

- 1 Lift the handset and press [ →] or [♣] when the unit rings.
  - You can also answer a call by pressing any dial key from [0] to [9], [\*], [#], or [INT]. (Any key answer feature)
- 2 When finished talking, press [ఀఀ♠o] or place the handset on the base unit.

#### Auto talk feature

You can answer calls simply by lifting the handset off the base unit. You do not need to press [ ]. To turn this feature on, see page 19.

To adjust the handset ringer volume when receiving a call Press (A) or (V).

#### **Handset locator**

Using this feature, you can locate the handset if it has been misplaced.

- 1 Press (•)) on the base unit.
- 2 To stop paging, press [•w)] on the base unit or press [>>0] on the handset.
























The handset phonebook allows you to make calls without having to dial manually. You can add 50 names and phone numbers to the handset phonebook.

# Adding entries to the handset phonebook

- 3 Enter the party's name (16 characters max.; page 34). → [■/OK]
- 4 Enter the party's phone number (24 digits max.). → [■/OK]

# Finding and calling a handset phonebook entry

Handset phonebook entries can be searched for by first character or by scrolling through all handset phonebook entries. When you have found the desired entry, press [ ].

#### Scrolling through all entries

- 2 Press [▲] or [▼] to display the desired entry

# Searching by first character (index search)

- 1 (四)
- 2 Press the dial key ([0] to [9]) which contains the character you are searching for (page 34).

 Press the same dial key repeatedly to display the first entry corresponding to each letter located on that dial key.

**Phonebook** 

- If there is no entry corresponding to the letter you selected, the next entry will be displayed.
- To change the character entry mode:
   [○] → Select the character entry mode. → [►]
- 3 Press (▲) or (▼) to scroll through the phonebook if necessary.

#### Changing a name, phone number

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#### **Phonebook**

### Chain dial

This feature allows you to dial phone numbers in the handset phonebook while you are on a call. This feature can be used, for example, to dial a calling card access number or bank account PIN that you have stored in the handset phonebook, without having to dial manually.

- 1 While on a call, press [\_\_\_].
- 2 Press [▲] or [▼] to select the desired entry.
  - To search by first character (index search), see page 17.
- **3** Press (►) to dial the number.

The message indicator on the handset flashes until you have listened to all new messages.

While message alert is on, battery operating time is shortened (page 12).

# **Time settings**

#### **Alarm**

An alarm will sound for 3 minutes at the set time once or daily. Set the date and time beforehand (page 13).

- 1 [ $\blacksquare$ /OK]  $\rightarrow$  "Handset Setup"  $\rightarrow$  [ $\blacktriangleright$ ]
- 2 "Time Settings"  $\rightarrow$  [ $\triangleright$ ]
- **3** "Alarm" → Press [▶] 2 times.
- **4** Select an alarm mode. → [▶]

Off	Turns alarm off. Press [►] again, then press [★①] to finish.
Once	The alarm sounds once at the set time. Enter the desired day and month.
Daily	An alarm sounds daily at the set time.

- 5 Enter the desired hour and minute. → [■/OK]
- **6** Select the desired ringtone.  $\rightarrow$  [ $\triangleright$ ]
- 7 "Save"  $\rightarrow$  [ $\triangleright$ ]  $\rightarrow$  [ $\circlearrowleft$ 0]

#### Note:

- To stop the alarm, press any dial key.
- When in talk or intercom mode, the alarm will not sound until the call has ended.
- If you select "Once", the setting will change to "Off" after the alarm sounds.



















### Base unit settings

### **Using Caller ID service**

#### Important:

 This unit is Caller ID compatible. To use Caller ID features (such as displaying caller phone numbers), you must subscribe to Caller ID service. Consult your service provider/telephone company for details.

#### **Caller ID features**

When an outside call is received, the caller's phone number will be displayed.

- Phone numbers of the last 50 callers will be logged in the caller list.
- While listening to a message recorded by the answering system using the handset, you can call back the caller without having to dial the phone number (page 27).
- When caller information is received and it matches a phone number stored in the unit's phonebook, the stored name will be displayed and logged in the caller list.
- If the unit is connected to a PBX system, you may not receive the caller information.
- When the caller dialled from an area which does not provide Caller ID service,
   "Out of Area" will be displayed.
- When the caller requested not to send caller information, either no information or "Private Caller" will be displayed.

#### Missed calls

If a call is not answered, the unit treats the call as a missed call. The number of missed calls is shown on the display. This lets you know if you should view the caller list to see who called while you were out.

#### **Call Waiting Caller ID**

This is a service of your service provider/telephone company and will only operate if you have subscribed to this service. When you hear a call waiting tone

during a conversation, the display will show the second caller's information. You can answer the second call by pressing [R]. The first caller will be placed on hold. Press [R] again to switch back to the first caller. Consult your service provider/telephone company for details of this service.

#### **Caller ID announce**

When you receive an outside call which has phone number information, the handset announces the displayed phone number from the handset speaker.

- To announce outside caller's phone number, you must first subscribe to Caller ID service. Consult your service provider/telephone company for details.
- When receive a call while on the phone, the 2nd caller's phone number will not be announced even if you subscribe to both Caller ID and Call Waiting Caller ID services
- The announcement is heard at the ringer volume (page 19).
- This feature can be turned on or off (page 14).



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# Answering System Features

# **Answering system**

The unit contains an answering system which can answer and record calls for you when you are unavailable to answer the phone.

#### Important:

- Only 1 person can access the answering system (listen to messages, record a greeting message, etc.) at a time.
- When callers leave messages, the unit records the day and time of each message. Make sure the date and time have been set (page 13).

#### Memory capacity

The total recording capacity (including your greeting message and caller messages) is about 20 minutes. A maximum of 64 messages can be recorded.

- If message memory becomes full:
  - "Answer Sys. Full" is shown on the handset display
  - the answer on indicator on the base unit flashes rapidly

# Turning the answering system on/off

#### Using the base unit

Press [ o ] to turn on/off the answering system.

• When the answering system is turned on, the answer on indicator lights up.

#### Using the handset

### Greeting message





### Remote operation

Using a touch tone phone, you can call your phone number from outside and access the unit to listen to messages or change answering system settings. The unit's voice guidance will prompt you to press certain dial keys to perform different operations.

#### Important:

 In order to operate the answering system remotely, you must first turn on remote operation by setting a remote access code. This code must be entered each time you operate the answering system remotely.

#### Turning remote operation on

A 3-digit remote access code must be entered when operating the answering system remotely. This code prevents unauthorised parties from listening to your messages remotely. After you store your remote access code, remote operation is possible.



# Turning on the answering system remotely

If the answering system is off, you can turn it on remotely.

- 3 Enter your remote access code within 10 seconds after the long beep.
  - The greeting message is played back.
  - You can hang up, or enter your remote access code again and begin remote operation.

#### Changing the number of rings

You can change the number of times the phone rings before the unit answers calls. You can select 2 to 7 rings, or "Auto". "Auto": The unit answers after 2 rings when new messages have been recorded, and after 5 rings when there are no new messages. If you call your phone from outside to listen to new messages (page 28), you will know that there are no new messages when the phone rings for the 3rd time. You can then hang up without being charged for the call.

### Answering System Features

- you do not use the unit's answering system. Make sure that the answering system is turned off (page 25).
- If you would rather use the unit's answering system than the voice mail service provided by your service provider/telephone company, ask your service provider/telephone company to deactivate your voice mail service.

If your service provider/telephone company cannot do this, set this unit's "Number of Rings" setting so that this unit's answering system answers calls before your service provider/telephone company's voice mail service tries to answer your calls. It is necessary to check the number of rings required to activate the voice mail service provided by your service provider/telephone company before changing this setting.

### Operating additional units

#### **Additional handsets**

Up to 6 handsets can be registered to the base unit.

#### Important:

- The additional handset model recommended for use with this unit is noted on page 6. If other model handset is used, certain operations (handset settings, base unit settings, etc.) may not be available.
- Additional handsets will give you the freedom to, for example, have an intercom call with another handset while a third handset is on an outside call.

# Registering a handset to the base unit

The included handset and base unit are preregistered. If for some reason the handset is not registered to the base unit (for example, \mathbb{Y} flashes even when the handset is near the base unit), register the handset manually (page 30).

# To register an additional handset to the base unit (easy registration)

After purchasing an additional handset, register it to the base unit. Ensure that the additional handset is switched on. If it is not on, press and hold [%0] for few seconds to turn the handset on.



### **Character entry**

The dial keys are used to enter characters and numbers. Each dial key has multiple characters assigned to it. The available character entry modes are Alphabet (ABC), Numeric (0-9), Greek (ABΓ), Extended 1 (AÄÅ), Extended 2 (SŚŠ), and Cyrillic (AБB). When in these entry modes except Numeric, you can select which character is entered by pressing a dial key repeatedly.

- Press (◄) or (►) to move the cursor.
- Press dial keys to enter characters and numbers.
- Press [C/⊠] to erase the character or number highlighted by the cursor. Press and hold [C/⋈] to erase all characters or numbers.
- Press [\*) to switch between uppercase and lowercase.
- To enter another character located on the same dial key, press (►) to move the cursor to the next space, then press the appropriate dial key.

#### Character entry modes

Several character entry modes can be used when entering text. The characters that can be entered depend on the entry mode.
