

This TV is supplied with a moulded 3-pin mains plug for your safety and convenience.

A 10 amp fuse is fitted in this mains plug. Shall the fuse need to be replaced, please ensure that the replacement fuse has a 10 amp rating and that it is approved by ASTA or BSI to BS1362.

Check for the ASTA mark or the BSI mark on the fuse body.

If the mains plug contains a removable fuse cover, you must ensure that it is refitted when the fuse is replaced.

If you lose the fuse cover, the mains plug must not be used until a replacement cover is obtained.

A replacement fuse cover may be purchased from vour local dealer.

Do not cut off the mains plug.

Do not use any other type of mains lead except the one supplied with this TV.

How to replace the fuse:

# For plug type shown in example 1

Lift out the removable fuse cover with a screwdriver and replace the fuse, then refit it securely into the mains plug.

#### For plug type shown in example 2

Lift open the fuse cover in the mains plug with a screwdriver and replace the fuse, then press the fuse cover down securely.



# **Touch Pad Controller**

Touch Pad Controller is designed for the convenient operations, especially, on Home Screen or internet contents. You can operate the TV intuitively with this controller.

- Touch Pad Controller can be used by registering to this TV with Bluetooth wireless technology. The registration starts automatically when you press any buttons (except Standby On / Off switch) after installing batteries.
- · After registering, you can operate the TV without pointing this controller at the TV (except Standby On / Off switch).
- To use Standby On / Off switch, point the controller directly at the TV's remote control signal receiver because it works with the infrared. (You can operate the switch without registration.)
- It is recommended to speak within about 15 cm from microphone of Touch Pad Controller when using Voice Control function.





#### The remote control does not work or is intermittent

- Are the batteries installed correctly? → (p. 15)
- Has the TV been switched on?
- The batteries may be running low. Replace them with new ones
- Point the remote control directly at the TV's remote control signal receiver (within about 7 m and a 30 degree angle of the signal receiver).
- Situate the TV away from sunshine or other sources of bright light not to shine on the TV's remote control signal receiver.

#### No image can be displayed

- Check the TV is turned on.
- Check the mains lead is plugged into the TV and the socket outlet.
- Check the correct input mode is selected.
- Check the setting of [AV2] ([COMPONENT] / [VIDEO]) in [Input Selection] to match the output of the external equipment.
- Is [Contrast], [Brightness] or [Colour] in the Picture Menu set to the minimum?
- Check all required cables and connections are firmly in place.

#### Unusual image is displayed

# The display panel moves slightly and clattered sound is heard when it is pushed with a finger

 There is a little gap around the panel to prevent damage to the panel. This is not a malfunction.

# Display panel, Cabinet, Pedestal

#### Regular care:

Gently wipe the surface of the display panel, cabinet, or pedestal by using a soft cloth to clean the dirt or fingerprints.

#### For stubborn dirt:

- First clean the dust on the surface.
- (2) Dampen a soft cloth with clean water or diluted neutral detergent (1 part detergent to 100 parts
- (3) Wring the cloth firmly. (Please note liquids do not enter the TV inside. May lead to product failure.)
- (4) Finally, wipe away all the moisture.

#### Caution

- Do not use a hard cloth or rub the surface too hard, otherwise this may cause scratches on the surface.
- Take care not to subject the surfaces to insect repellent, solvent, thinner or other volatile substances. This may degrade surface quality or cause peeling of the paint.
- The surface of the display panel is specially treated and may be easily damaged. Take care not to tap or scratch the surface with your fingernail or other hard objects.
- Do not allow the cabinet and pedestal to make contact with a rubber or PVC substance for a long time. This may degrade surface quality.

# Mains plug

Wipe the mains plug with a dry cloth at regular intervals. Moisture and dust may cause fire or electrical shock.

# Rear panel (Cooling fan)

The unit is equipped with a cooling fan on the rear side. To remove dust or other foreign materials adhering to the fan, vacuum it attaching lightly the opening of the suction nozzle of a vacuum cleaner to the vent holes.

- Be extremely careful not to damage the display panel or other parts.
- A warning message appears when the cooling fan needs cleaning. If the message appears even after cleaning and then turning on, contact your local dealer.


